Emergency registration of nurses and other health and care professionals

Schedule 1 contains temporary modifications of

• The Nursing and Midwifery Order 2001 and the Health Professionals Order 2001

Suitability

 NMC will write to <u>midwives</u> who have left the register within the last three years to opt into a temporary emergency register but only those who are considered 'fit, proper and suitably experienced.'

Returning to Clinical Care

• NMC will encourage all midwives who are currently on the register but not working in clinical care to consider coming into clinical practice during this time.

Students

• NMC will allow undergraduate midwifery students to opt to undertake their final six months of their programme as a clinical placement.

Plans & Protection

- The midwifery and nursing emergency registers will go live within 24 hours of the emergency legislation being passed by Parliament and the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care advising the NMC that we are in a state of emergency.
- The government is ensuring that legal protections will be in place for those who take part in work as part of the Covid-19 response.
